Arrival in Torino

Torino is easy to reach by car, train or plane thanks to its strategic location that makes it a natural connection point between the surrounding Alpine valleys and the confluence and passage of major national and international communication routes.

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Getting from the Torino Airport to the Venue (Circolo dei Lettori, Via Bogino 9, Torino)

The main venue is [Circolo dei Lettori](#), located in the city centre.

Torino Airport is connected to the city centre by rail and two bus operators. Taxis and hire cars are also available on the 'Arrivals' level of the airport. We recommend you use bus or taxi to reach the city center easily.

BY BUS

The connection between the airport and Torino city centre is provided by:

- **Arriva Italia:** stops at Porta Nuova station; timetables and fares are available on the bus operator's [website](#) and the [Torino Airport website](#).
- **Flibco:** stops at Turin Porta Nuova station; timetables and fares are available on the bus operator's [website](#) and the [Torino Airport website](#).

BY TAXI

Taxis are located at the exit of the 'Arrivals' level and take around 30 minutes to reach the centre of Torino at an approximate cost of 40 €.

From **Milano Malpensa airport** it is possible to reach Torino with two shuttle services that reach the city centre in about 2 hours.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Public Transport Torino

Buses and trams cover all Torino, crossing it in every direction from early morning to late at night. The route of the first driverless underground railway in Italia connects Collegno (from the west) to Piazza Bengasi (from the south) to the city centre and to the stations of Porta Nuova and Porta Susa.

For the young (and young at heart) there is the "Night Buster" service, a safe way to get around at night: every Friday, Saturday and pre-holidays from the outskirts to the centre and back, with bus stops close to the main areas of nightlife.

Tickets can be bought from authorised GTT retailers (tobacconists, newsagents, cafés).



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To get around the city, we recommend **Moovit**: the app that allows public transport users to quickly find the best ways to reach their destination, know in real time the arrival time of public transport at the stop, and receive notifications about any sudden or planned changes to the public transport network.

A convenient service for tourists as well, the app is in fact available in 45 different languages and, thanks to the Gps position detected by the device, automatically sets the area where you are.
